"Since starting my apprenticeship with KEITS and North Farm Stud I have been able to progress with my dressage. I started competing at intro level and throughout my apprenticeship I was given many opportunities to compete. I have now worked my way up to now working on a dressage yard. Most recently I competed with my own horse at my first affiliated BD and won my Prelim and Novice with high scores. My plans for the future are to get my own horse to advanced- medium level.



Emma, Georgie and Lottie have recently all completed their level 2 Equine Groom apprenticeships together at Ellenwhorne Equestrian Centre in East Sussex. They are now about to all progress onto a Level 3 Senior Equine Groom Apprenticeship and stay with their current employer. They all feel their employability skills, including communication have developed hugely. Their advice to future apprentices in equine is that "hard work pays off and you do need to be dedicated as the job involves working long hours in all weathers. Make sure you keep up to date with all the course work that is set so that you don't fall behind."
