These concepts may seem complex, but they play a crucial role in shaping our society and the diverse communities we live in.

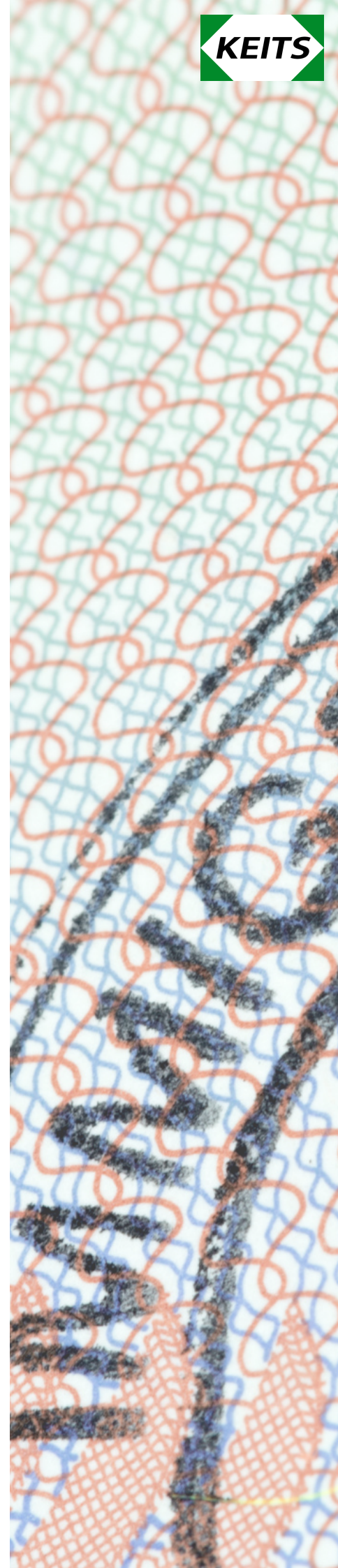
What is the difference?
